- 1. The Liquor product(s) to be distributed should comply with the definition provided in the Liquor Act 59 of 2003 and/ or the definition of the Liquor Products Act 60 of 1989 as and when amended;
- 2. The distribution activities should be conducted from premises and at a location approved by the relevant local authority;
- 3. Liquor may only be distributed to registered persons/ entities or other licensees;
- 4. The registrant must not employ a person who had not attained the age of 16 unless the employee is undergoing training or learnership contemplated in section 16 of the Skill Development Act No. 97 of 1989;
- 5. The registrant must comply with Customs and Excise Duties Act No. 91 of 1964;
- 6. The registrant must comply with all provisions of the Liquor Act 59 of 2003 and/ or any other relevant law:
- 7. The registrant shall provide the National Liquor authority with a BEE Compliance certificate annually;
- 8. The registrant should provide the National Liquor Authority with a Tax Clearance Certificate annually.
