INTRODUCTION



- Performances of Works
- Treaty Obligations
- Akin to Personality Rights
- Relationship to Copyright
- Dates from 30 December, 1967 with retrospective effect.



PERFORMANCES ENJOYING PROTECTION



- Performances of Persons Who Perform Works
- Effectively Scripted Works
- Folklore
- Traditional Works



CONDITIONS FOR PROTECTION



- Place of Performance
- Broadcast Live
- First Recorded
- Qualification in Respect of Foreign Performances



TERM OF PROTECTION



- Fifty Years
- After Performance Took Place; or
- Recording Made (if incorporated in a sound recording)



NATURE AND SCOPE OF PROTECTION



- Vests in Performer
- Monopoly in Certain Acts (known as "restricted acts"), namely:
- Broadcasting or Communicating Unfixed Performance
- Making Recording of Live Performance
- Making Reproductions of a Recording of Performance

PROTECTION (continued)



- By Means of a Commercial Record,
 Without Payment of a Royalty:-
 - 1) Broadcasting the Performance
 - 2) Transmitting the Performance in a Diffusion Service
 - 3) Communicating the Performance to the Public("Needletime")



CIVIL LAW INFRINGEMENT



- Performing "Restricted Act" in Relation to a Substantial Part, without Consent
- "Consent"
- Collective Consent by Manager of a Group
- Deemed Consent when :-
- 1) <u>Rebroadcast</u> takes place where initial broadcast has been authorised
- 2) Representative of a group incorrectly represents that he is authorised and performer of restricted act reasonably believed that the authorisation was valid.



CRIMINAL INFRINGEMENT



- Performing Restricted Act in Relation to Substantial Part
- Distributing Infringing Copy
- Possessing Master of Infringing Copy

With "Guilty Knowledge"



CIVIL LAW REMEDIES FOR INFRINGEMENT



- 1) Interdict
- 2) Patrimonial Damages; alternatively penal damages in amount determined by Minister; alternatively,
- 3) Statutory Damages prescribed by Minister, without any proof of damages being suffered
- 4) Destruction of Masters
- 5) Costs



CRIMINAL SANCTIONS FOR INFRINGEMENT



- 1) Fine and/or Imprisonment
- 2) Payment of Prescribed Penalty to Performer, in the Case of Performance of Restricted Act.
- 3) Destruction of Masters



EXEMPTIONS FROM INFRINGEMENT



- Private Study and Personal Use
- Criticism or Review
- Teaching, Scientific Use, Legal Proceedings, Demonstrating Equipment
- "Ephemeral Recordings" by Broadcaster



DISPOSITION OF PERFORMERS RIGHT
