

BACKGROUND & SCOPE OF WORK

After numerous articles continued to appear in the media alleging abuse of Lottery funding, the Department in March 2020, authorised an investigation into the allegations. The mandate included investigation of the following projects:

Four (4) NLC Proactive Funding Projects allegedly linked to the COO, his friends and relatives:



BACKGROUND & SCOPE OF WORK

- The allegations:
 - **Denzhe Primary Care:** It is alleged that funds were improperly distributed to a hijacked nonprofit organisation, "Denzhe Primary Care" (Denzhe) through a Proactive Funding transfer. Denzhe received funding to build a new drug rehabilitation centre and the facility is still incomplete;
 - **Zibsimazi:** It is alleged that the Director of Zibsimazi is related to an employee of the NLC. It is also alleged that the company was set up in May 2017 and awarded the funding in November 2017;
 - Life for Impact: It is alleged that the NPO has 1 common director with Zibsimazi. It is alleged that a shelf company was created and awarded the NLC funding 6 weeks after it was created;
 - I am Made for God's Glory: The NPO received R11m and it is alleged that R2m of that was paid to a private company owned by a person related to an employee of the NLC.







PROGRESS & FINDINGS

- the dtic is awaiting the appointment of a law firm to provide legal guidance to the Department in relation to the implementation of the recommendations;
- The case in respect of Denzhe is with the SAPS;
- Investigations in respect of the other 3 projects is still in progress;
- Report inclusive of the remaining 3 projects is expected by 15 September 2020
