

Regarding water security, in response to the occasional regional supply challenges, Dube TradePort will soon invest in its own internal reticulation network. By bulk-purchasing water from eThekwini Municipality and managing distribution within our precinct, we aim to provide tenants with a three-day buffer supply, ensuring consistent access and service even during municipal interruptions. Lastly, many of you, within the Special Economic Zone, continue to supply regional markets, particularly across SADC and Europe. 
