

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The Nkomazi SEZ is pivotal to export of commodities not only from Mpumalanga Province but also from the Limpopo and Gauteng provinces of South Africa through Maputo port;











- Strategically positioned in the border town of Komatipoort, directly south of the N4 (national road), 5 km from the Lebombo Border Post (between SA & Mozambique) and 73 km to Mananga Border Post, (between SA and Eswatini);
- The SEZ has unique strengths and advantages due to its proximity to the Maputo Corridor connecting to the Port of Maputo. It provides exporters with easy access, through Maputo Port, to the export markets of South East Africa, the Indian Ocean Rim and Far East Asia;







- An attractive investment destination, designed to be a **multi-sectorial industrial zone** focusing on agro-processing/manufacturing; production of nutraceuticals and also serve as Logistics Hub. It offers a unique opportunity to reduce the costs of freight by creating an inland port that can handle cargo containers and bulk material transport through the transhipment of road cargo to rail (intermodal) then Maputo port, thereby reducing the truck congestion on the roads.
- Provides responsive infrastructure that follow, in the main, a green infrastructure theme to support businesses operating into the zone. This includes the access to a source of alternative energy, i.e. the natural gas of the Mozambican coast since the gas-pipeline from Maputo to SASOL (Secunda) passes through the zone.





- The Nkomazi SEZ is set to provide One-Stop-Shop services, incentives, an innovative platform, a competitive and transparent market environment and timeous and efficient responses to investors' market requirements.
- **Investment packages will be tailored to suit individual demand,** supported by private equity funding solutions aimed at supporting the creation of black industrialists, as well as incubation of new business initiatives within the SEZ programme.













NSEZ Interim Phase: Progress to date (1)

- Nkomazi SEZ Entity not listed with National Treasury as yet.







Corporate Governance


- NSEZ Entity Board appointed and Acting CEO also seconded in Nov 2024;
- 2020-2025 Five-Year Strategic Plan and 2024/5 Annual Performance Plan in place, however, working with ISA to bring the Business Plan into bankability level, work to be completed around May/June 2025
- Organisational Structure, Job profiles and Job grading for 20 posts in place;
- Process to fill nine (9) critical positions in 2024/25 financial year already underway



Land Development

- NSEZ Entity entered into a fifty-year (50) Land Lease Agreement with Nkomazi municipality and already registered with the Deeds Office;
- The designated site of the Zone has obtained an Environmental Authorisation (EA) and Water Use License (WULA);
- Parameter/barrier clearvu fence already installed for ± 300 ha (Phase 1);
- Township establishment almost complete;
- Preliminary designs in place and professionals already procured to conduct detailed engineering designs – expect to complete work around July 2025







Status on Professional Work

- Engineering professionals already appointment in January 2025 at a cost of approximately R56 million.
- Detailed engineering designs for bulk water, sewerage, roads and storm water as well all internal services to be finalised in September 2025.
- Installation of required bulk infrastructure and reticulation of internal services projected to take 18 months, that is, to be completed in March 2027.
- Investors anticipated to start occupying sites in Phase 1 from April 2027 onward.







Status on Professional Work

- The professional engineers will develop the detailed designs and required engineering drawings for the development of the BOQ (Bill of Quantities)
- These BOQ are critical for the development of the required tenders for the appointment of contractors for the installation of the bulk and internal services once the required funding for **physical infrastructure development** has been secured.
- For the required physical infrastructure development, the Department is working together with Infrastructure South Africa (ISA) to secure funding from national treasury through the Budget Facility for Infrastructure (BFI) reform initiative


- Co-chaired by Head: DEDT or a designated Chief Director and DDG or a designated Chief Director (the Dtic)

Institutional Arrangements












KEY CHALLENGES

- Inadequate Budget for Bulk Infrastructure despite securing funding from BFI (national Treasury);
- Inadequate budget from Nkomazi Local Municipality to cater for Bulk Infrastructure development of the NSEZ precinct (i.e. the impact of the NSEZ on, inter alia, additional needs such as housing, school facilities, health facilities, and economic infrastructure for light industries, etc)
