QUESTION FOR WRITTEN REPLY

QUESTION NO. 1877

Mr S Thambo (EFF) to ask the Minister of Trade, Industry and Competition:

- (1) (a) On what year was the Black Industrialist Programme established and (b) what is the breakdown of the total (i) number of applications this department has received and (ii) amount of funding (aa) allocated and (bb) disbursed for the specified programme in each year since its inception up to the latest date for which information is available;
- (2) what total number of employees (a) currently perform work related to the specified programme and (b) have been part of the team for the entire duration of the programme;
- (3) whether he has been informed about the allegations of a syndicate operating within his department where some of the departmental officials are accused of manipulating the approval and site inspections processes related to the Black Industrialist Programme; if not, what is the position in this regard; if so, what form of investigation has his department initiated in this regard;
- (4) whether his department has disbursed funds allocated for the (a) 2025-26 and (b) 202627 financial years under the specified programme; if not, what is the position in this regard; if so, what are the relevant details? NW2106E

REPLY:

- (1) (a) The Black Industrialists Scheme (BIS) was established in 2016.
 - (b)(i) On average the BIS receives 105 applications per year.

(ii) (aa) The amount of funding approved per year since inception is as per table below:

(2) (a) There are 25 officials working on the BIS programme. These officials are on different levels ranging from Trade and Investment Advisors to Chief Director.

(b) Staff composition changes when the quantity of work changes, with staff

allocated to incentives with higher numbers of applications and or claims as and

when the need arises.

(3) I am not informed about a syndicate operating within the Department relating to

officials manipulating the approval and site inspection processes pertaining to the

BIS programme. The position is that there is currently no information put before the

Department to substantiate the allegations made. I am not aware of any

investigation currently underway specifically pertaining to manipulation of approvals

and site inspection processes within the BIS programme.

Checks and balances are embedded in screening and processing of applications

and claims performed by different teams in order to ensure proper management.

Internal Audit

o Internal Audit assesses projects per year and conducts independent site visits to

check for any misalignment to the Standard Operating Procedures or spurious

activities.

Auditor General

• The Auditor General also audits BIS projects per year and conducts independent

site visits to check for any misalignment to the Standard Operating Procedures or

spurious activities.

There are no funds disbursed for the financial years 2025/26 and 2026/27. Funds

can only be disbursed in a relevant financial year once new payment codes are

cleared by the dtic Finance Unit at the beginning of a new financial year, that is in

early April.
