PRASA's contract with the Gibela Rail Transport Consortium



- On the 14th October 2013, PRASA and Gibela signed the following two agreements:
 - Manufacture and Supply Agreement (MSA)
 - Technical Support and Spares Supply Agreement (TSSSA)
- Financial Close reached 26th April 2014


- The MSA has been contracted on the following terms:
 - Contract Value: R59 billion (including VAT, excluding inflation)
 - Number of Trainsets: 600 New Trains (3600 vehicles)
 - o 20 trainsets from Brazil Plant
 - 580 trainsets from Local Factory
 - Duration: 15 year delivery programme

TSSSA

- The TSSSA is the agreement governing the maintenance of the New Trains.
- The **scope** of the TSSSA will ensure that Gibela will perform at least one overhaul on each New Train.
- It is estimated that the TSSSA will have a duration of 19 years.



Local Content:

- is measured throughout the supply chain, i.e., up to the raw materials used within a component
- measures South African value add on components, i.e., if the raw material is foreign, but has local manufacturing, then the local manufacturing portion will only count as Local Content.
- Gibela will thus require companies within its supply chain to have Local Content commitments on their products

21% South African sourcing value

- First 20 trains manufactured at Alstom's manufacturing plant in Lapa, Brazil
- Trainsets from Brazil use local material and components such as stainless steel, Glass, doors, panels etc.



67% South African sourcing value

- First trains to be produced in South Africa at Dunnottar
- Large increase in South African content due to global companies localizing



74% South African sourcing value

- By trainset 34, base localization will be established
- This level of localization sustained during manufacturing
- Local content optimization will continue to increase localisation where possible

Local Factory and Supplier Park: Manufacturing of Trains in SA



Local Factory

- Construction of the factory at Dunnottar Park, Ekurhuleni has advanced:
 - Construction of Training Centre and main Car-Body Shell Building is complete
 - Main Fittings and Tooling have been installed for start of operations
 - Start of basic operations, including testing of manufacture processes begun in January 2018
- Gibela on-boarding suppliers for South African manufacture
- Manufacture has progressed well, with 1st local train delivered in December 2018



Supplier Park

- Is a critical enabler for the development of a central industrial rail hub which will support localisation
- Mobilization to develop the Supplier Park that supports the Local Factory is currently underway
- Construction of the Supplier Park cannot begin until:
 - Exemption from MFMA regulations for subleasing
 - Sublease finalised with Ubumbano
- Council approval of sale of site to PRASA obtained from EMM
- 7 Companies already have in principle agreement to have facilities in the Supplier Park





- Currently programme targets learners from 17 schools in the Ekurhuleni region (see right) and two schools in Soweto and Tshwane
- Programme run in conjunction with Math Centre

Programme successes

- First batch of students with strong matric pass rates compared to local / national average (see deep dive)
- 450 learners engaged in the programme in 2016
- An additional 150 learners will benefit each year post 2016
- Additional programmes in Tshwane and Soweto to benefit an additional 150 learners annually


